Teacher's notes

Reinforcement worksheet I

- Pupils read the story on the worksheet and complete the crossword.
- **Key:** I wood, 2 leg, 3 playing, 4 (down) bridge, 5 fell, 6 dirty, 7 walking, 8 jumping, 9 not, 10 arm, 11 (across) father, 11 (down) fast.
- Ask pupils to read the story again, this time to find out what Alvin was doing on the three occasions when he fell. They write the sentences on the three lines.

Key: I He was jumping over a rock.

- 2 They were walking across the bridge.
- 3 He was standing on one leg to take his dirty boots off.
- Optional follow-up activity: Pupils create a role play.
 One pupil is a friend and the other is Alvin. The friend asks Alvin what happened to his arm and Alvin explains.
 They can invent new scenarios, but Alvin should still fall three times.

Reinforcement worksheet 2

- Pupils find the odd word out in each row and circle it.
 When pupils have circled all the odd words, check their answers. Ask pupils to explain why that word is odd and what the other words are. Next they break the code to find the secret message.
- Key: Odd words out: B bridge, C cave, D explorer, E tent, F west, G rucksack, H rock, I sledge, J flashlight.

 Secret message: Marco Polo was seventeen when he left home to go to China.
- Optional follow-up activity: With books closed, pupils
 play a game in teams. Ask pupils to name three things in
 each of these categories: things you can put in a rucksack,
 compass points, places made of water, things you can
 climb, things an explorer can sleep in, types of weather,
 etc. Award one point for each correct answer.

Extension worksheet I

- Set the scene for the class: two explorers have had a terrible week. One is writing a diary. Pupils read the diary (Monday-Friday) and circle the correct tenses to complete the sentences.
- **Key:** 2 fell, 3 were climbing, 4 started, 5 were crossing, 6 put, 7 were sleeping, 8 fell, 9 was jumping, 10 fell.
- Pupils order the words to make questions about the diary.
 They ask and answer the questions with a friend, then match the questions to the answers.
- Key: Monday: What was he carrying on his head?
 (3 A rucksack), Tuesday: What were they climbing up?
 (1 A mountain), Wednesday: What were they crossing?
 (5 A bridge), Thursday: Where were they sleeping? (2 In the tent), Friday: Was he jumping over a rock? (4 Yes, he was).
- Optional follow-up activity: Pupils suggest ideas for what happened to the explorers on Saturday and Sunday. Encourage them to use the past continuous and past simple tenses with when.

Extension worksheet 2

- Pupils read the instructions and draw, colour and write to complete the picture. They need red, blue, green and orange crayons. When they have finished, they compare their picture with a partner's. The pupils then write a short story about the picture beginning with the words While the explorer was sleeping....
- Optional follow-up activity: Pupils write their name at the top of their paper. They exchange papers and read each other's stories. They read at least two and suggest a title for each paper (they can't repeat titles). When pupils get them back, they choose their favourite title.

Song worksheet

- Pupils read the song and find the answers in the pictures.
 They choose the two correct prepositions from each picture and write them in the song. They listen to the song (Track 6) to check their answers.
- **Key:** 2 in, 3 down, 4 after, 5 over, 6 out, 7 on, 8 in, 9 in, 10 on.
- Optional follow-up activity: Pupils interview a partner to learn about their adventures. Write some of the following questions on the board: Have you ever ... climbed a mountain? ... seen a cave? ... swum in a river? ... seen a crocodile? ... been to an island? ... seen a waterfall? ... been to the jungle? ... camped out? ... slept on the ground? ... seen a snake?

Topic worksheet

- Pre-teach UFOs, aliens and theory. Pupils read the first part
 of the text. As they read, they look at the map and draw
 the symbols where the incidents happened. They read the
 text to find six possible ideas for why boats and planes
 have disappeared and they tick the ones they believe. Let
 pupils discuss them, then hold a class vote to find out
 which theory is the most popular.
- **Key:** Possible causes for disappearances: UFOs, aliens, underwater volcanoes, boats and planes had problems, bad weather / hurricanes and storms, they weren't in the Bermuda Triangle.
- Optional follow-up activity: Pupils write an adventure story in pairs. They are having trouble at sea or in the air and they are afraid because they are in the Bermuda Triangle. Help pupils with an opening line, e.g. We were sailing in the Atlantic when suddenly Display the stories on the wall and let pupils read them.



1 Read about the Bermuda Triangle. Where were the boat, the plane and the ship? Draw them on the map.





A boat called the SS Marine Sulphur Queen was sailing somewhere between Miami and Cuba in 1963 when it went missing. People looked for the ship for 19 days but it was never found.

A plane (flight NC16002) disappeared when it was flying half way between Puerto Rico and Miami. No one found

the plane or the 32 people on it.
In 1967 a ship was having problems at sea, so the captain called the Coast Guard. The Coast Guard, who help people in trouble at sea, arrived 19 minutes later to look for the ship, but they never found it. It was only one mile south of Miami.

2 Read and underline six ideas for why things disappear in the Bermuda Triangle. Tick the theories you believe.

More than 1,700 ships and planes have disappeared in the Bermuda Triangle. Writers and film-makers often say that there are UFOs in the Triangle; others say that aliens live in the region. Read about some of the many other theories.

Underwater volcanoes often happen in the Bermuda Triangle. Pilots in planes can't see the water clearly and ships sink. The boats or planes had lots of problems. For example, people think that flight NC16002 had an engine problem and crashed.

The Bermuda Triangle has a lot of hurricanes and storms. Some people believe that ships disappear because of this strong weather.

Some boats and planes were not in the Bermuda Triangle at all!
