GIRL: Oh yes! Don't worry about that!

MAN: What will happen on the moon? Will a bus take me to my hotel?

GIRL: No, you can walk. We'll give you spacesuits to put on.

MAN: Excellent! And which day will I come home again?

GIRL: Well, it's Saturday today so you'll come back on Monday. Is that alright?

MAN: Yes. Can I buy the ticket now?

GIRL: Of course!

- MAN:** If you want. What would you like to draw?
- GIRL:** Can I draw a cake on the table?
- MAN:** Yes! What a good idea! Then colour it blue.
- GIRL:** That's a strange colour! But OK!
I'm doing that now.
